THE PURPOSE OF THE SUBJECT, LEARNING OUTCOMES:

The aim of this course is to equip students with the necessary knowledge about the system of media genres, especially interviews, reports and opinion articles. Throughout this course, students will develop their knowledge about the components of the interview as a media genre, about the different types of interview and about the methods how to conduct an interview. The second half of semester is focusing on report as a media genre and its different interpretations; the purpose is to clear the special features of news reporting, reporting and investigating reporting. Students learn about the basic tendencies of the political and professional culture in preparing interviews and reports. The aim of the last part of the semester is to get students acquinted with the concept and practice of opinion journalism.

SUMMARY OF THE CONTENT OF THE SUBJECT

A general introduction in the media genres. Short history and basic features of interview, report, opinion journalism. A practical knowledge how to conduct an interview or report; the basic skills required to these media genres. The preparation of a presentation about investigating journalism. Critical thinking about opinion articles.

STUDENT'S TASKS AND PLANNED LEARNING ACTIVITIES:

Active participation at the classes, home works, creative writing, presentation (ppt)

EVALUATION OF THE SUBJECT:

On the very first class all the aspects and criteria of the final grading of this course unit will be known for the students (attendance, activity, tasks, presentations); further evaluations constantly, practically every week; grading of the main tasks are on Coospace, individual evalution for every student; general statements about merits and failures in classes; beside the knowledge of the subject basic English language skills in writing and verbal communication are also parts of evaluation; grades are awarded on a five-grade scale.
